

Weekend Food Needed!!

We are asking everyone to consider donating food in support of the weekend food that we deliver to the town's elementary schools each month. Currently, we have very little food for the upcoming February delivery on Friday the 13th. If you are able to donate any of the following items, then please bring these to church and leave them in the basket by the front entrance. We need:

- individual breakfast items (instant oatmeal cups and small cereal boxes)
- fruit snacks (applesauce/mixed fruit cups and fruit snack packages)
- individual lunch items (mac & cheese cups, instant soups, other pasta or noodle meals)
- lunch snacks (granola bars, chips and pretzels, peanut butter and cheese cracker packages)

Carol's Closet Information

Clothing - for Feb/March - we will only be collecting men's and women's coats, and winter sweaters/tops. Gloves/hats/scarves and very gently used boots are welcome. We are cutting back on collecting pants as neither men nor women seem to take them, likely because they really need to be tried on and they don't want to do that.

Incontinence & Hygiene products - Incontinence liners, pads, and briefs as well as liners/pads for those with a period are items that are provided only via donation. We do not use funds collected for Carol's Closet for these items, so these donations are greatly appreciated.


- Women's briefs - we have a huge abundance of size L. We do not need any Large for some time. However we are completely out of S/M or Medium. There is some need for XL.
- Men's briefs - we do not have a huge need for these, but it is helpful to have a small supply; we can use a few packages.
- Pads - we have plenty of incontinence pads right now
- Liners - this is the biggest need. Looking for liners for bladder control.

If folks want to donate paper towels, tissue, toilet paper, soap, deodorant, toothpaste - the things we do purchase with funds, but our money goes further if we also get donations - these are the specifications needed:

- Paper towels - single wrapped rolls
- Toilet paper - packages of 4 (preference) or individually wrapped single rolls
- Tissue - single flat boxes. Square boxes are okay, we just have to give 2 in a bag.
- Soap - Dove, Palmolive, unscented soaps - either single bars or packages of 2 or 3.
- Toothpaste - full size tubes only (we don't give out the travel sizes)



Mid-Week Lenten Services




Building Use-The following groups will be using the Fellowship Hall and/or the Sanctuary:
