it all happen as we positively impact our members, with the groups who rely on our buildings for meetings, and for the mission work we do here, there, and everywhere it's needed.

There will be challenges. We already are challenged by a smaller population of members contributing time, talent, and treasure to our church which means our Call for a new Pastor will be for a part-time Pastor and our lay leadership will be relied upon more heavily. The Call Committee, led by Dave Taylor, is hard at work and working close with the New England Synod on options.

A newly approved housing complex will be built behind our church soon and this may offer an opportunity to reach more families around us. Once we have a new Pastor, I plan to make reaching out to local housing complexes and the community in general an important part of our work to grow our church.

We are indeed blessed as Licensed Lay Minister John Prosen has been leading our worship and working with us during our Pastoral Call and transition period. The words he shares with us, in and out of the Sanctuary, are gifts we appreciate and they help guide us.

I also wanted to share with you that at my first Council meeting in May I shared with the group the idea of having security cameras installed in and around our building for several reasons. First, for the security of our church staff who often are in the building alone. Second, to be able to monitor the many people and groups who are entering and exiting our building daily. Third, to provide a record of any incidents that may occur on our property including but not limited to accidents, unauthorized visitors, snow removal by vendors, etc. Having the cameras and signs that note that video surveillance is taking place will also be a deterrent for inappropriate behavior. These camera systems are much less expensive than they used to be, are easy to install, and will give us peace of mind for a busy church property. The Church Council agreed with me, and we've asked the Property committee to take on this project to research and make recommendations, and we'll keep you informed. I will say that we also discussed making sure the surveillance is video only and will be set so that it doesn't record audio to protect everyone's privacy.

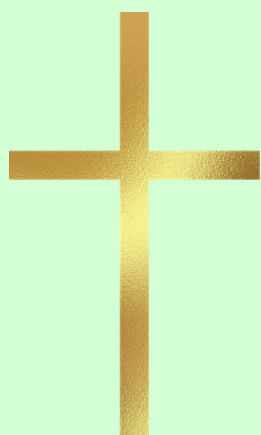

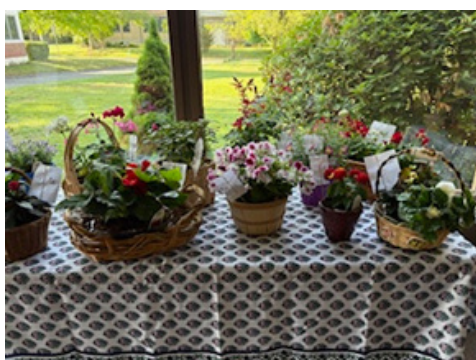

Mother's Day Plant Sale



A huge THANK YOU to everyone who supported this year's plant sale. It was an enormous success!! There were four long tables filled with all types of flowers, assorted plants, vegetables, and herbs. A Thrivent Action Team grant was used to purchase plants and materials from Draghi's Farmstand in South Glastonbury. Proceeds from the sale exceeded \$800. WAY TO GO ST. MARK!!!!

Half of the proceeds will be donated to Glastonbury Links Together and the other half will be used to offset St. Mark's garden expenses. A very special note of appreciation goes to Deb Gresens who contributed beautiful pots and helped with potting up many of the plants.

Glastonbury Links Together

Over the past several years, St. Mark has been providing weekend food for elementary school aged children who are at risk of food insecurity. St. Mark delivers the food on the second Friday of each month of the school year. Presently, 42 students receive weekend food, and the last delivery for St. Mark will be on Friday, June 12th.

We are in need of food donations, especially lunch meals (mac & cheese, Ramen noodles, cup of soup, etc.) and particularly meals that are dairy free. Please no cans, as this makes it too heavy for the children to carry.



During this upcoming summer, St. Mark will once again collaborate with other Glastonbury Links Together organizations to support the WACY Camp at the Welles Village Community Center. We are awaiting information as to Camp needs for snacks, drinks, etc., for this summer. As soon as we receive information, it will be shared

St. Mark's Garden

Three garden work sessions have already been held to place the new straw bales around the border, weed the garden, and begin planting. A Thrivent Action Team grant was used to help offset some of the cost for the new straw bales. Also, deliveries of fresh asparagus have been made to Manchester Area Conference of Churches (MACC) food kitchen. Ronald Kraatz planted the asparagus crowns two seasons ago, and this is the first season that they could be harvested. This was great advance planning and a terrific effort by Ronald!!

We will be holding 'Cool of the Evening Garden' sessions throughout the summer, both to continue planting the garden and then later on to harvest vegetables and herbs. In the past, everything has been donated to the MACC Food Pantry. We will also be looking to provide the Glastonbury Food Pantry with some of the harvest. New this year are two free-



standing garden planters for those who love to garden but have difficulty with bending over to do so. Many hands make for easy gardening and lots of fun and fellowship. Our Collection Project for the Anna Kobylarz Hope Foundation

During March and April, members of our church came together to collect new children's clothing, onesies, diapers, pull-ups, and baby wipes for young children to support the **Anna Kobylarz Hope Foundation** and their efforts to provide kits of supplies for families in need in Central Connecticut and children at CT Children's Medical Center.

We received a **Thrivent Action Grant** to support the project and our members responded wonderfully. We collected more than three full boxes of supplies for the Foundation which helps them keep their expenses lower and impact more families in need. We also collected almost \$200 in cash donations for the organization.



In late April, after Anna returned from the Ukraine where she supports efforts to provide medical care to orphans in the war-torn country, we made the delivery of donated items and cash to Anna, and she was so happy for the gifts. We're sharing a photo of that delivery to Anna's Butterfly Closet and thank you for your support with this special project.

Each activity earns points, and you'll keep track using our scorecard.

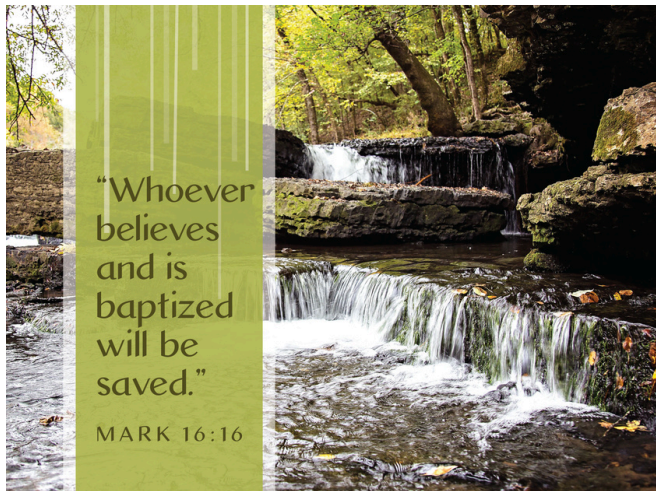
