



## A Message from the Council President

This is my last chance to be the lead article in the Messenger. After this last year, which we survived, and the community functions quite well, how can I sum it up?

During Pastor Marschhausen's last year serving as Pastor many years ago, the council had a vision retreat during which we developed the vision that is posted by the Martin Luther window in the fellowship lounge. The complete version is:

In relationship with Jesus Christ through the word that gathers and nourishes us, we receive the truth that brings meaning and fulfillment to all aspects of our lives.

We seek to share His truth and our joy.

The short version is "In Joy We Share Christ's Truth." There was much discussion about whether it should be "In Joy" or "With Joy". The word "with" describes how you share. Would it be proper to be joyful when sharing with a person who just lost a loved one? In most circumstances, the response would be "No". The manner in which you share "Joy" should be appropriate to the situation. The word "in" describes a state of being, or what you feel inside. Hopefully, knowing that Christ is the resurrection and life creates that inner joy that the vision acknowledges.

What I find interesting is our vision appears to be the overall theme of John Prosen's sermons. He constantly preaches of God's world-saving grace and how it comes into our lives, which should give us joy. He encourages us to share the truth of Christ's redeeming sacrifice with our friends and neighbors. This is how the church, meaning God's Church (big "C" as John always points out), grows. Hopefully, some of the growth will spill over into our pews.





- \***House Church**-with leader Jennifer Campbell will meet in the Fellowship Hall March 29<sup>th</sup>.


